### IN CASE YOU MISSED IT

Vice President Tom Miller oversaw the 2014 Paul Harris Fellow induction ceremony. The first part was a brief presentation by John Loeffler, a charter member and former president. He described some highlights from the club's 27-year history using the Rotary motto "Service Above Self" as a working title. He mentioned that one of the key themes of Rotary International is the Polio Plus Program, through which RI and its collaborators hope to end polio in the world by 2018. Since its founding, Shepherdstown Rotary has contributed \$81,205 to the Polio Plus Program—an average of about \$1,500 per current member. John reflected on a 1933 presentation by Paul Harris, the founder of Rotary, in which Harris described the first community project undertaken by Rotary. He then segued into a short list of key community projects undertaken by our club, including providing leadership to fund and establish the Good Shepherd Interfaith Volunteer Caregivers; providing leadership in the renovation of Rumsey Memorial Park; helping with the startup of the Contemporary American Theater Festival; helping to establish the Welcome Center; initiating a Rotaract Chapter at Shepherd University; leading in the highway cleanup project; leading in the installation of new welcome signs in Shepherdstown; and initiating an annual "Our Ball, Your Charity" event that in recent years has infused \$23,000 to \$28,000 annually into local charities. He described the Shepherdstown Club as the "epitomy of teamwork."

Karen Kinnett presented 2014 Paul Harris Fellow inductee Monica Lockett, administrator of the Canterbury Center, and reviewed Monica's contributions. Joining the club in April 2009, Monica became chair of the Community Service Committee in July 2010, and moved up to club vice-president in 2011-12 and president in 2012-13. She recently initiated the "This I Believe" essay contest at Shepherd University, and arranged for the oldest contestant, a 90-year-old resident of Canterbury Center, to read her essay at the Byrd Center. Monica attended the recent Rotary District Conference and brought back the seeds of an idea to establish water wells in cooperation with clubs in Africa—a project that's still germinating. In her remarks after the recognition, Monica called this club "inspiring" and said that she meets each new club opportunity with the conviction: "Yes, I can take on this leadership role." She was recognized with a standing ovation by the members.
