I hope that you find this overview helpful. The YPA initiative is an innovative and exciting way to support young people in the pivotal high school age range of 14 to 18.

Introduction

YPA 2021-22 is available to high schools and youth service clubs and organizations that apply and are accepted to participate.



Int'l Day of Peace Kick-Off September 21, 2021

YPA launches with a livestream introductory event focused on energizing and engaging young people as peacebuilders. Recordings available for re-broadcast.



Online Peace Platform September 2021 – May 2022

Interactive, innovative YPA online platform provides content and experiences throughout the school year. Core course, including a certificate upon completion, is **My Peacebuilder Foundations**.



Peace Projects in Action January – April 2022

Students can imagine and develop peace projects independently, or, apply for a training and mentoring experience called **Leading Peacebuilding Teams**. It's available to support small groups that want to learn how to lead other students in effective peace projects.

The year's accomplishments and results are profiled in the YPA Online Peace Platform and virtual or in-person get-togethers.

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Every year, on September 21st, communities around the world observe the International Day of Peace.

It's a day devoted to the ideals of peace. In 2021, we are all being called on to think creatively and collectively about how to heal from the COVID-19 pandemic, build resilience, and keep moving towards a better world.

YPA officially launches on September 21, 2021 – the International Day of Peace – with a livestream introductory event focused on energizing and engaging young people as peacebuilders.

YPA Activators at participating high schools and youth service clubs and organizations will issue a CALL TO ACTION to join an innovative, interactive YPA Online Peace Platform that guides peace education content and experiences. This includes three courses available for students and adults: My Peacebuilder Foundations, Guiding Young Peacebuilders, and Leading Peace Project Teams. The ultimate goal is Peace Projects in Action.


The one-hour International Peace Day Kick-Off will incorporate creative performances, youth influencers, guest speakers, and:




My Peacebuilder Foundations is the core online course and interactive content that is delivered in sequential modules. The self-paced content can be completed in approximately 20 hours. Course completion achieves understanding of fundamental drivers of conflict and peace, as well as a more informed capacity to frame a problem statement and create a peace project idea.

Eight Pillars of Peace to understand systemic drivers of conflict & peace




UNLEASH framework for peace project ideation, design and development



These frameworks are presented within an interactive format designed by an award-winning learning management design team. The course leverages and is powered by **CONTENT** and experiences from education, training and mentoring programs previously delivered by NewGen Peacebuilders.

"7HSM" Structure for Modules

Every module involves **Self-Reflection** activities that feel like *looking in a mirror*, **Gaining New Knowledge** *peering through a window*, and **Interactive Exercises** *opening/walking through a door to a new world of peacebuilding*.

What's in the Modules?



Six modules guide participants – interactively – through fundamentals of power, conflict, violence and peace. Insights gained span:



- Historical perceptions of conflict and violence, as well as effects of modern media on these perceptions
- Distinctions between "negative peace" and "positive peace"



Indexes of global peace, positive peace, human development, happiness, and more

Role and potential of young people as essential peacebuilders




- Reflections on whether the world has become more peaceful or violent
- Broad perspectives on what constitutes "harm"
- Distinctions between pity, sympathy, empathy, altruism and compassion
- Essential "ways of being" including active listening, focusing, self-awareness and emotional management
- 5 **Heart**
- Connections between universal ideals of human rights and peace
- Core peacebuilding values
- Personal "triggers" that get in the way of peacebuilding
- Distinctions between service and peace as a process for positive change
- Essential tools and skills for peacebuilding
- How to identify underlying drivers of conflict and peace
- Problem framing and idea development for effective peace projects





Assessments are included at the end of *each* module and after completion of all modules. The course includes supplemental content that is useful for other class research, papers and capstone projects. Resources are available throughout the Online Peace Platform for those who want to learn even more about peacebuilding.

Supporting Youth-Led Projects



Foundations with additional content on the fundamentals of "positive peace"; tips on developing successful peace projects; and Code of Conduct guidelines and principles for working with peace project teams.

After completing Guiding Young Peacebuilders, mentors can work independently with local project teams or there is an option to apply to become a mentor for Leading Peace Project Teams (starts January 2022). "LPT" includes a short training and facilitated support for mentors and student leaders who want to guide student clubs and groups to deliver effective peace projects.

CASE STUDY: DEMOCRATIZE and UNIFIED

Leading Peace Project Teams

January – April 2022


This opportunity is for students who want to more fully develop leadership and project management skills, as well as guide other students to put Peace Projects in Action. Small groups with a minimum of five student leaders can be paired with peace projects mentors.

Students & Mentors: Project Implementation

How do students refine peace project ideas in what feels like an age of chaos? Small teams of student leaders paired with a teacher, service club advisor or community mentor who has completed **Guiding Young Peacebuilders** are able to prototype, test and implement peace projects based on ideas generated through **My Peacebuilder Foundations**.

In a two-day accelerator style virtual/in-person summit, teams and mentors receive facilitated instruction and guidance that results in a peace project plan. Implementation takes place over 8-10 weeks with a commitment from team members and mentors of 2-3 hours per week. Questions that are answered during the experience are:

- What type of conflict or violence are you addressing? (Direct, Cultural, or Structural)
- What project type are you addressing?
 (Awareness, Service, Advocacy or Philanthropy ASAP)
- What are your SMART Goals? (Specific, Measurable, Actionable, Realistic, Time-bound)
- If your project could be repeated or replicated, what do you hope will change? (Theory of Change)
- What are your team agreements for working together?



WOW! Completion of these peace projects leads to an advanced certification that supports students in applications for competitive awards, scholarships and recognition. The highest quality peace projects are eligible to be featured on the YPA online platform.

Questions & Answers

The implementing organizations for YPA 2021-22 are NewGen PeacebuildersSM (NGP) and Outward Bound Peacebuilding (OBP). NGP and OBP are experienced leaders of workshops, trainings and dialogues in multiple cities, countries and contexts. YPA online, virtual and live learning content and experiences are powered by NGP-based instruction and facilitation.



Is there a cost to participate?

If accepted into YPA, there is no cost to participate. However, the number of high schools and youth service clubs/orgs. that will be accepted is limited by total available sponsor funding. Acceptance notifications are made on a rolling basis with a deadline of Sept. 10th for high schools and youth service clubs/orgs.

that want to participate starting with the Kick-Off event on International Peace Day - Sept. 21.

Is the content approved by school boards or other authorities?

YPA is currently intended as an educational and experiential option for administrators, teachers and advisors within high schools and youth service clubs/orgs. The choice to make use of YPA resources is voluntary and at the discretion of educators and advisors who believe YPA is consistent with established education and service learning standards.

What are the responsibilities of a high school or service club/org.?

A Principal, Assistant Principal, designated administrator or teacher may apply on behalf of a high school. An advisor may submit an application for a high school or community youth service club/org. For each application, a Youth Peace Activator must be identified and serve as a primary contact with YPA. If multiple service clubs from a high school want to be involved, one application can serve as "umbrella" for all. Any school-based club that applies is encouraged to promote the YPA opportunity to the school broadly, including other service clubs. A student inquiring about YPA must coordinate with an adult who has authority to sign a YPA agreement.

Who can apply?

Public, private, charter and virtual high schools or youth service clubs within high schools can apply. Community youth service clubs/orgs. may also apply. Participation in 2021-22 is generally limited to the geography identified in the map on the inside cover of this brochure. Interact Clubs are encouraged to apply due to connections with Rotary Clubs, but applications are welcome from Student Government Associations, Model UN, UNICEF chapters, Key Club, Beta Club, NHS, Scouts, Boys & Girls Clubs, and other groups.

What are the benefits?

YPA puts youth at the center of building and sustaining a culture of peace. A unique aspect of YPA is an innovative web-based platform that is mobile-friendly and contains Content, Challenges, Case Studies and Community. Students drawn to and or required to complete service learning projects will find team action peace project learning and experiences especially relevant. Certifications are provided for completion of different aspects of the journey. Qualifity team action peace projects can be considered for additional recognition and awards.
